

Pastor's Greetings,

I was pleasantly surprised to find the Catechism reflecting on the prayer of the Virgin Mary [2617-2619]. The opening conversation with which St. Luke introduces Mary addressed by Gabriel is itself a prayer. I had never thought of it that way. Gabriel is God's mouthpiece addressing Mary and the means of her response in prayer to God. The Lord through Gabriel reveals the working of divine grace in her and accepts her free assent to the call, "Let it be done to me according to your word." Mary says "Amen" or "Yes" to God's purpose. The Word became incarnate, the New Covenant was thus inaugurated, in the middle of this prayer between God and Mary.

The Catechism reflects further on other scriptural sayings and actions of Mary, now viewed as her praying. Her praise is that of a faithful Jewish woman, a Daughter of Zion, who by grace is made the Mother of God and of the Church. Through the scriptures the prayers of the Blessed Virgin Mary become also the prayers of the Church. She not only tells us to "Do whatever he (Christ) tells you," she leads the way by her example. The Catechism begins consideration of prayer "In the Age of the Church" with Pentecost [2623-2643]. The Holy Spirit comes upon the Church in power while they are gathered at prayer, but it was and is the same Spirit who forms the Church in the life of prayer. That prayer is "founded on the apostolic faith; authenticated by charity; (and) nourished in the Eucharist (see Acts 2:42)." The Catechism explains: "The Holy Spirit, who thus keeps the memory of Christ alive in his Church at prayer, also leads her toward the fullness of truth and inspires new formulations expressing the unfathomable mystery of Christ at work in his Church's life, sacraments, and mission. These formulations are developed in the great liturgical and spiritual traditions. The *forms of prayer* revealed in the apostolic and canonical Scriptures remain normative for Christian prayer." It then names five forms of prayer: Blessing and Adoration; Petition; Intercession; Thanksgiving; and Praise. In every case God initiates and sustains the prayer in which we communicate with God.

"Because God blesses, the human heart can in return bless the One who is the source of every blessing." Our prayer blessing God *ascends* in the Holy Spirit through Christ to the Father. The grace of the Holy Spirit *descends* through Christ from the Father, blessing us. Adoration prayer is that blessing of God which we raise acknowledging ourselves as creatures and God as Creator.

Petition is the most usual form of our prayer. It arises from our needs as creatures (sharing the form of adoration) and also from our fallenness as sinners turning back to God who calls us home. Deep at the core of honest petition prayer is the movement of the Holy Spirit interceding for us with groans beyond the power of speech. Contrition is important here. "Asking forgiveness is the prerequisite for both the Eucharistic liturgy and personal prayer [2631]." Beyond that, all petition is centered on the quest for the Kingdom of God, that it may come with all that is necessary to welcome it. "Christ is glorified by what we ask the Father in his name."

Intercession shares the form of petition and is a participation in the intercessory prayer of Jesus, for he intercedes with the Father on behalf of each and every human being. With the Holy Spirit's intercession, our participation in the intercession of Jesus lies at the center of what we call the communion of saints.

Thanksgiving (like blessing, adoration, and praise) characterizes the prayer of the Church, especially at Eucharist. It acknowledges with joy (and generosity) the gifts of God's goodness. Jesus Christ offers the Church participation in his own thanksgiving prayer to the Father which has its climax now in sacramental communion and in eternity, beatitude.

Praise takes up all the other forms of prayer and "carries them to God." This is the prayer which glorifies and magnifies the Lord. Praise ultimately requires poetry and song, for it carries the creature in Christ and the Spirit beyond the limits of words. It leads out of self into union into divine joy. On earth, the Eucharist is the summation of all these forms of prayer. "It is 'the pure offering' of the whole Body of Christ to the glory of God's name and, according to the traditions of East and West, it is *the* 'sacrifice of praise' [2643]."

In Chapters Two and Three which follow there is teaching on learning how to pray with sources, guides and manners of prayer. But it is made perfectly clear that prayer is not a matter of technique, style, or idiosyncrasy. There is even a section on "The Battle of Prayer." Fr. Richard

**WHAT'S A NOVENA? PART IV: NOVENA TO OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE** The year 1531 marked a new era in the evangelization history of the Catholic Church in the north American continent: the apparition of Our Lady of Guadalupe to Saint Juan Diego (on Dec. 12<sup>th</sup>).

Ever since, the faithful have been celebrating such event with prayer, liturgy, song and more. One of the most common ways people prepare for such celebration is the prayer of the Novena to Our Lady of Guadalupe. For about five centuries, families and friends (mostly in Mexico and now in different places in America) gather either at church or at home in order to pray the novena. The image of Guadalupe is placed on a central and dignified place and is usually decorated with red roses or carnations, symbols of Our Lady.

All of the attendants pray for a particular personal intention and also for a community one. They pray the Rosary, sing Marian songs and read Scripture. There is usually a catechist (when the priest or deacon cannot be present) who offers a brief reflection on the Scripture passage read that day. They conclude the novena with a closing prayer and a procession -weather permitting.

Our Parish invites you to come and pray the Novena to Our Lady of Guadalupe every day from the 4<sup>th</sup> to the 12<sup>th</sup> of December at 6pm. Next week we will talk about the specifics of our parish novena.

**Thanksgiving Day**

I am no longer surprised, but am still amazed these last several years by public attempts to celebrate Thanksgiving Day while avoiding all references to God. Unlike Easter and Christmas which the Christian Church inaugurated and still keeps as Holy Days of worship and celebration, Thanksgiving Day was civilly proclaimed by Mr. Lincoln and established by our federal government as a national day for acknowledging Divine Providence, back when this was proper. Lately, embarrassed by possible references to the Almighty, people stumble all over themselves to acknowledge *things* for which to be grateful, being mute about *to whom* gratitude is due. But there is no thanksgiving if there is no benefactor. This attempt to reduce gratitude and thankfulness to a sentiment of "gladness to have" is silly and foolish. Those who bless themselves for their abundance are not grateful. They are boastful. Let them call the holiday, "Turkey Day." For if there may be some truth in the saying, "You are what you eat," then there is profound truth in the saying, "You become like the gods you worship." Fr. Richard

Though there are very many families in very miserable situations in my village and Uganda as a whole, I feel that we continue helping the same family we helped last year of Maria Nalongo with her thirteen grandchildren. However, they may share with others who are in same similar situation. The following is a list of the requirements for the children in the Family.
