

Pastor's Greetings,

Our living Tradition of faith is both apostolic and catholic. In that its source is the "overflowing" gift of the Holy Spirit in Jesus Christ (of which Jesus speaks in John 4:14, and see also the river of life in Revelation 22), this Tradition is likened to "living water." It is a marvelous image which the Catechism uses to speak of our communion of life in prayer. We participate in the living current of Christian prayer [Catechism, IV, Ch. 2]. Like a great river, this communion runs through time and space, uniting all God's people in Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit. The Catechism then leads off chapter two, "The Tradition of Prayer," with the image of the wellsprings of prayer. Following that, it speaks of the of "the way of prayer"; and "guides for prayer."

Building upon all that has already been said about Christian prayer, the Catechism identifies Jesus Christ as the source of our prayer life and the Holy Spirit as the "living water" flowing out, in, and through us by way of our praying. In this regard then there are four primary "wellsprings" or "fountains" in the Church for our prayer: the Word of God in Sacred Scripture; the Sacramental Liturgy of the Church; the theological virtues of Faith, Hope, and Love; and "today" or our present moment of life and God's gracious presence.

No one should be surprised that the Word of God is the first source mentioned. What may surprise is the idea that for the scripture to become alive in a person, it must be prayed not just read. The Bible is not just a "mine" from which to "extract" prayer material, it is entirely an encounter with the Word of God praying with us. The text is received as God speaking, that means one reads as a listening to God. The reading is paced with an answering or a speaking back to God, followed by a new listening and taking to heart (a way of praying also called "lectio divina"). The believer prays the scriptures as a dialogue with God.

All of the Church's liturgies are the prayer of Jesus Christ himself in which he draws us to participate. Each is a communion in the Holy Spirit. This is true not only of the sacramental ritual moment of prayer, for the liturgy opens out into being lived, to be an ongoing sacrifice and act of living worship of the individual Christian as well as the of the Church corporately, the Body of Christ.

Faith, Hope, and Love are the greatest of the Spirit's gifts. Each is also, as a living dialogue with God, a living prayer. Most have heard of the little prayers called "acts" of faith, hope, or love. But these are just suggestive formulas for igniting a continuous receiving and responding in the Spirit, through Christ, to the Father. Here is where one may do as Saint Paul urges, i.e., "pray always." This then leads into the final "wellspring," our "today." We are creatures living and becoming in time. The present is our "now." The future is always approaching, the past always flying away. The first requires some planning and responsibility. The latter likewise requires responsibility, but also a letting go with thanks and/or contrition. The present or today is all that we ever actually have. Even memory of the past and anticipations of the future are aspects of the present. There is a grace for living the present with the Lord, a walking with God. This commends us to a "practice of the presence of God" in our present moment, a welcoming of God, a giving of ourselves to God, a receiving of the moment in all its reality from God. The prayer of the "now" of the "today" employs all the other "wellsprings." It begins so simply, but it may well require our greatest struggle of conversion. It was this font of prayer which Adam and Eve set aside to accept the serpent's offer. But we are designed for this kind of prayer, God intending the prayer of "today" to be transfigured in us into the prayer of "eternity."

I am amazed and delighted in the reflections on prayer offered for our reflection and growth in the Catechism. There are still nine substantial articles of varying lengths remaining. I intend to continue through them all as we journey through Advent toward Christmas. For me this is very much a walking with God. Fr Richard

 Saul of Tarsus was a fundamentalist Jew from Tarsus who studied under the great Rabbi Gamilliel and would later be known as Paul, the Apostle to the Gentiles.
